



## *Helps in Praying with Others*

- **Pray silently** that God would direct you to the right person.

- Ask Him for the place in **scripture just for her**.
- **Ask** if she would like someone to pray with her.
- Ask her **name**.
- Ask, “**What is Jesus saying to you?**”  
Make sure it is specific.
- Some general appropriate scriptures:  
Ephesians 3:14-21 (filled with all the fullness of God)  
Romans 8:31-39 (nothing shall separate from God’s love)  
I Thessalonians 5:23-24 (entire sanctification)  
Ezekial 36: 25-30 (new heart, no more famine)
- **Have her read the scripture** and place her name in it
- **Ask her questions** regarding the scripture  
(ie. Ez. 36: 29 “From how much of your uncleanness will he save you? Part? Just a little? What does the scripture say?” She replies, “No, all!”)
- **Have her pray**. “You talk to Jesus and say to Him what you have said to me.” If she is praying generally gently ask, “Is He saying more to you than you are verbalizing right now?”
- Then **you can pray**.
- Have her pray again and **thank Jesus** for what He has done, and then you pray and thank Jesus.
- Have her **underline and date the scriptures** she just read. Have her write and date in her prayer notebook what God has done in her life. If she doesn’t have a Bible or prayer notebook, help her get one.
